

Perspective views



Initial map display

In addition to the normal display, the map screen can also be displayed as a 3D (perspective) view. A typical perspective view map screen with no route set is shown above. All the usual on-screen features and touch controls are available when using perspective map display.

Selecting the type of display

The type of map display is selected from the Navigation Setup menu.




Scrolling the map

When scrolling the map in perspective view, the map orientation adjustment arrows are displayed. This allows the map heading to be changed independently of the vehicle heading.

- To change the map orientation, touch either of the adjustment arrow buttons as required.

Note: After touching one of the adjustment arrows, the map is displayed heading up.




Map display under guidance

A typical perspective view map screen while under guidance is shown above. Any combination of 2D and 3D views can be selected for the main map display and the guidance screen overlay.

Selecting 2D/3D views

After selecting **2D/3D View** from the Navigation Setup menu, the perspective view setup screen is displayed showing the options available:

2D/3D Mode

3D Map Angle

- Select the option required.

These options are described as follows.

2D/3D mode

Any combination of 2D and 3D views can be selected for the main map display and the guidance screen overlay.

- To select, touch the **2D** or **3D** buttons as required.
- Touch **OK** to apply the new settings.

3D map angle

The screen shows the map display in perspective view. The perspective angle can be changed by using the adjustment control displayed on the screen.

- To change the angle, touch either of the adjustment arrow buttons as required.
- Touch **OK** to apply the new setting.

Preset angle setting

A preset perspective angle setting is also available.

- To select the preset setting, touch **Default**.
- Touch **OK** to apply the new setting.

Note: The map zoom level and heading can be changed if required, using the touch controls displayed.
